A Message from the Moderator

What a difference a month makes! Within a span of a few weeks, our church received the resignation of our long standing and much loved pastor, and the suspension of church activities due to COVID-19. I wanted to write to you all to let you know your church leadership is actively working both situations and has things under control given the unusual situation we all are in.

As it relates to the resignation of Rev Jen, I know all of us are sad to see her go. She has done so much for our church over her twelve years here as pastor, and has helped strengthen the community and family spirit our church has. While it would be nice to be selfish and to keep her to ourselves, Rev Jen has a gift that needs to be shared with other churches, and God has called her to help the Congregational Church of Littleton, MA. The deacons have been working with the Southern New England UCC leadership (SNEUCC) to help us find an interim minister that will help us along the journey of finding our new pastor. This is a process that may take 12-18 months, as it is very important we find the right pastor that will fit our church and our mission. You will see more about that in the Deacon's update in this issue of the Spire. One of things we have been planning, but has not been resolved, is our goodbye to Rev Jen. Due to COVID-19, we are not exactly sure of when it will be, but I promise you we will have one.

Now with the craziness that is COVID-19. While it may seem scary, the limitations the state and the government have put on us is really the correct thing to do, and we took the recommendations of the SNEUCC leadership and have suspended all activities until May 4th. Given the daily briefings we have been getting, it is likely this suspension will be expanded. The church council is meeting weekly during this time to make sure the church continues to function. We have encountered challenges with the loss of weekly offerings, and with our investments taking a hit. We would like to ask all our members to send in their offering either via mail or online banking during this time if you aren't already doing it. Rev Jen has been doing Facebook live streaming of sermons on Sunday, and check ins on Tuesday and Thursday nights. She has also been making sure people are being contacted. We are planning some creative ways to celebrate Holy Week and Easter services since we cannot be together in person.

One final note. As a member of this church for all of my life, the one constant I have seen with our church is the people and the love we have for one another. We can power through this because we stand as one. This also means that we look out for each other. Given the circumstances of companies shutting down or slowing down, if you are in a need for assistance, do not hesitate to reach out to Rev Jen. The Deacon's fund is separate from our budget, and we use this for this type of need. Please don't be afraid to ask.

If you have any questions or concerns, feel free to reach out to either Rev Jen, the Deacons, or myself. Take care and stay healthy and safe until we see each other again!

Deacons Update on Interim Pastor Search

The Deacons met on March 15 via video conferencing with Wendy Vander Hart, Associate Conference Minister for the SNEUCC. The purpose of the meeting was to walk us through the process for both Interim Pastor and Settled Pastor search. It was decided for this search the team would be the Deacons, Moderator and a representative from the Christian Education (CE) committee.

The first step is to complete an Interim Church Profile. This has been completed by the Deacons and sent to the SNEUCC. Next the conference will send profiles of Interim Pastors they feel would be a good fit and the search team will review and interview the candidates. This process generally takes 2-4 months.

Once the Interim Pastor is in place the work for a settled pastor begins. The Interim pastor will assist the church to develop a new Church Profile and in organizing the search. The Associate Conference Minister will provide guidance throughout the process. The time frame for a new pastor to arrive is generally 12-18 months.

Following the Interim Pastor selection, we will be seeking volunteers to be on both the development of the church profile and also the search/transition team. Obviously due to our small congregation there will most likely be overlap on these committees.
