Habitat for Humanity Kaua'i Hawaii 2024

Aloha, Greetings from Kaua'i, Hawaii a beautiful island. However, it has one of the most expensive housing markets. Native Hawaiian's work two jobs and have difficulty finding a home to own. Kaua'l Habitat for Humanity has supported many families in ownership of a new home. This year they have 140 new homes lined up to build.

Wendy Schneider and Jan Krohn joined the South Shore group for our 3rd one-week building trip to Kaua'i. The group, although smaller this year, were enthusiastic workers. Work assignments included a day painting and filling holes with putty, painting under the blessed relief of the the porch shade, and working in the re-sale store. Kauai's Habitat group's re-sale store is supported with donations from the community and refund products from department stores. The store, which is a major source of revenue, also offers great bargains for shoppers. We helped to sort and price items during our time there. 
