From the Interim Pastor

Dear Members and Friends,

The hymn, "We Gather Together" was originally written to celebrate the Netherlands' victory over Spain thus gaining independence. It has been translated many ways with a variety of verses added. Most of you are familiar with this verse: We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing. God chastens and hastens His will to make known. The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing sing praises to God's name, He forgets not his own. (The war imagery shows through clearly.) I found many other versions as I looked through my array of hymnals. I share these words with you today:

We gather together to ask for God's blessing, to live in community, seeking God's will. We come now as sisters and brothers, confessing the sins that divide and the wrong in us still. Beside us, forgiving, enabling, sustaining, you call, us O Savior, to life that is new. You draw us away from self-centered complaining. You lead us and guide us in ways that are true. (A bit clumsy in spots fitting the tune but it is the sentiment, I'm sharing.)

I have heard many laments about what we can't do during this pandemic. As the season of traditional gatherings approaches this loss will become more apparent. My family has already decided that we will not be gathering for Thanksgiving. Zoom, facetime and phone calls will have to do. For some, it might feel like a relief to not have to participate in these obligatory gatherings.

- 4. Place the jar in a prominent place along with slips of paper, pencils, crayons etc.

It is pausing to notice and appreciate the things that we often take for granted, like having a place to live, food, clean water, friends, family, pets, even access to technology.

A Little Hymn History

These two hymns are ones that we will be using this fall. While we really can't raise our voices in song, I thought that it might be interesting to know about the composers and lyricists of the hymns we sing.

"O Jesus I Have Promised" was written on the occasion of the confirmation of his own two sons and daughter at Castle Camps in 1869. The hymn tune was written in 1881 by Arthur H Mann, who at one period in his life served as organist and choirmaster at King's College, Cambridge, famous for its superb choral music. Tune: Angel's Story A.H. Mann 1883

"This Is the Day of New Beginnings" 1978 words - Music Carlton Young 1987 Music: Brian Wren Brian Wren (b. Romford, Essex, England, 1936) is a major British figure in the revival of contemporary hymn writing. He studied French literature at New College and theology at Mansfield College in Oxford, England. Ordained in 1965, he was pastor of the Congregational Church (now United Reformed) in Hockley and Hawkwell, Essex, from 1965 to 1970. He worked for the British Council of Churches and several other organizations involved in fighting poverty and promoting peace and justice. This work resulted in his writing of Education for Justice (1977) and Patriotism and Peace (1983). With a ministry throughout the English-speaking world, Wren now resides in the United States where he is active as a freelance lecturer, preacher, and full-time hymn writer. He has also produced What Language Shall I Borrow? (1989), a discussion guide to inclusive language in Christian worship.
