Thank you to those who responded to our letter regarding the steeple repairs and to the congregation who attended the annual meeting in person and on zoom. We had a good discussion on the choices for repairing and/or redesigning the steeple exterior.

At the annual meeting the voting members gave the Trustees up to the amount in the Capital Find, approximately \$31,432.00, to make the steeple weather tight.

To complete the project for that amount of money we will remove the non-functioning clocks, repair the interior, then re-shingle the steeple sides.

The Trustees are also working on replacing the windows in the parlor and the minister's office which are long overdue for replacement.

What does a "Can-do Congregation" look like? A Lenten Study

We've been invited to be part of a pilot study on can-do congregations. Two ordained ministers who are also researchers are working on creating an assessment tool to answer that question: What are the attributes of a can-do congregation. Barbara Laymon and Jake Morrill were presenters at the Clergy Clinic that Rev. Geary attended at the beginning of February. They asked the participants to take their tool back to the local church and take it for a test drive.

They created this assessment using a similar tool created by Daniel Papero to assess personal and family health. We will use the first five weeks of Lent as an opportunity to do some self and congregational discovery by using the assessment. When we are done, we will share our feedback with the researchers as to how helpful the assessment tool was.

This 5-week study will occur after worship each Sunday at 11:15ish beginning March 6th. Each session will go for an hour. Please notify the church office if you are interested so we can send you some preparatory information. Walk-ins will be welcomed also.

MEMORIES

At the Leadership Retreat at the beginning of February, I asked the church leaders to spend some time pondering the way memories work. We used 1978 as our starting point because there was so much talk about that snowstorm. If you remember the storm of '78, you might get anxious when the meteorologists suggest we could get another storm like that. But it's important to allow our memories to grow up. The amount of wind and snow that was experienced in '78 would be experienced differently in 2022. The forecast system is so much better so folks have greater warning. The snowplow technology has advanced significantly so we are better able to clear the roads today. We have cell phones now, so communication is better. This doesn't mean we don't need to be prepared for a storm, we do; but we don't have to have the anxiety that the same sized storm will bring the same sized problems. We need to let our memories grow up.

By the same token, if we had a wonderful experience in our past, we might try to recreate it by going to a certain place or gathering with certain people. Often though, it just isn't as good. Instead of trying to recreate something from the past, it is more promising to get in touch with the pleasurable emotions we felt back then and allow them to grow up. Consider what you might do today that would bring those same positive emotions to your current self.

Our second example was to have folks imagine their 1978 self, attending a worship service where the congregation was singing out of a 1914 hymnal. For everyone that hymnal was old. There are 64 years between 1978 and 1914. There are also 64 years between 1958, the year the last Pilgrim Hymnal was published and 2022. It's the same number of years but for many in the congregation the Pilgrim Hymnal isn't old. This is because it was published in their lifetime. None of us was alive in 1914. How we date an object often has more to do with our relationship with it rather than its actual age. I'm sure you can think of items that are defined as old or not old based on your relationship with them rather than their actual age.

Lastly, I asked folks to be their 1978 self and to remember the older people in their lives. Who were the wise people and what did they do? Many of us are now the age that those wise people were back then. Is it possible to see ourselves as those elders? Those wisdom holders? What did we think was the responsibility of those elders to the community back then? What do we think our responsibility to the community is now?

Memories can be tricky. They can trap us in our past, hindering our ability to live fully today. They can also be a firm foundation on which to build our present. And, memories can be a springboard to propel us into the future.
