Prudential Corner

Here is a summary of our finances over the first ten months of this year (1/1/23-10/31/23)

We continue to report the financials up against the budget that was approved at Annual Meeting, which included a full time salary for a settled Pastor. At this point, looking at our actual income versus expenses, we are only \$2,804.66 from breaking even on the year. Income from rentals continues to outperform what was budgeted, which we hope will continue into 2024 as people realize that our space is available for multiple uses. We are hopeful that between the Jolly Holly fair and some pledge catch ups, we can end 2023 on a financially positive note.

We are projecting that we will not require more withdrawals from our investments, holding at the \$25,000 we have already liquidated from our account this calendar year. Though the market has fluctuated back and forth, not having to remove a lot of funds has had the added benefit of these funds providing us income and expounded growth. At the end of August, our balance with Vanguard was \$316,210.94. This leaves us with \$253,148.15 in the General Fund, \$50,986.18 in Board Restricted Funds, and \$42,106.05 in Donor Restricted Funds.

The annual Stewardship letter and pledge cards were sent out in mid-November, we hope that we can continue to count on the support that so many of you have provided in the past. The future of this 300+ year old institution depends on all of us and all of those that live around us. There are exciting things happening in and around our community, with many new folks moving into our wonderful area. We look forward to welcoming back those that have taken a step away as we see great things happening with our church and its people in 2024.

JOLLY HOLLY TIME!


It's the most wonderful time of the year!
