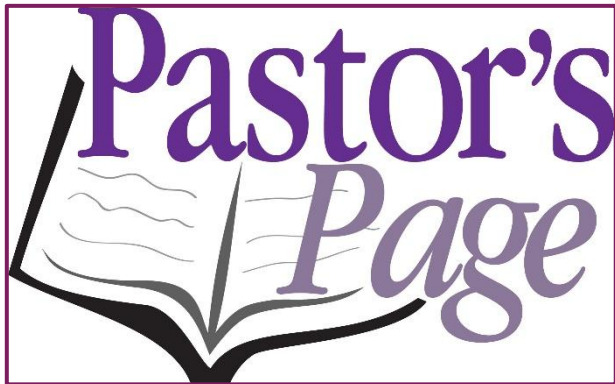

Dear Beloved in Christ,

As we journey together through this sacred season of Lent, I invite you to pause and reflect on the story of the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:1-42). It is a beloved story by many and only found in the Gospel of John. This scripture is rooted in a complex history. For centuries, deep tension and mistrust shaped the relationship between Jews and Samaritans, so much so that many Jews would travel long distances just to avoid passing through Samaria. Yet, Jesus chooses to cross these boundaries, speaking not only to a Samaritan, but to a woman. This was a bold move in a culture where such public interactions were rare and discouraged.

Their conversation at Jacob's well is the longest Jesus has with anyone in the Gospels. It centers on the offer of

“living water.” Living water meant fresh, flowing water, much preferred to stagnant well water. But Jesus brings deeper meaning, using “living water” as a symbol for the renewal and life the Spirit offers to all who thirst for God.

In this passage, we see Jesus, weary from traveling, sitting by a well in Samaria. When the Samaritan woman approaches, Jesus asks her for a drink. This request leads to a deep, theological conversation that transcends cultural barriers and offers the gift of “living water”—a water that quenches not just physical thirst but the thirst of the soul.

How often do we, like the woman, come to the well of life carrying burdens? Lent is a time to recognize the wells we turn to (e.g. wells of busyness, materialism, or self-reliance) and to hear Jesus' invitation to take another path.

This living water can truly refresh and renew us. Just as the Samaritan woman left her jar behind and ran to share the good news with her community, we too are called to leave behind what no longer serves us and to share the hope and joy we find in Christ.

During this Lenten season, I encourage you to spend time in prayer, reflection, and acts of service. Let us draw near to the well of God's mercy, allowing living water to cleanse, heal, and transform us. May we, like the Samaritan woman, encounter Jesus in a way that changes everything.

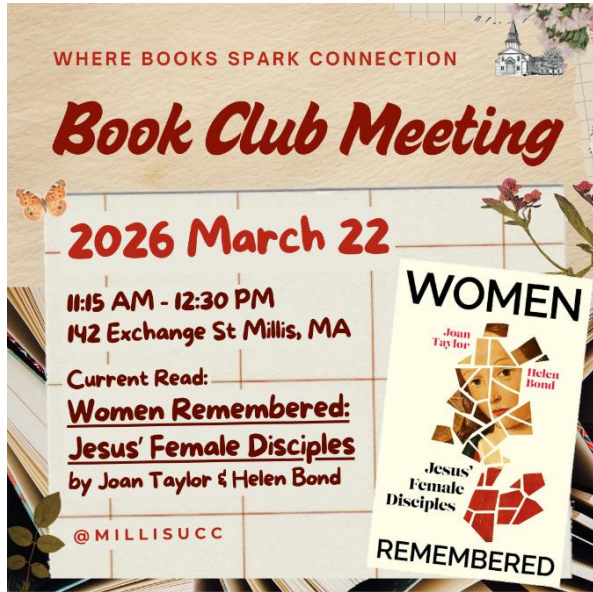

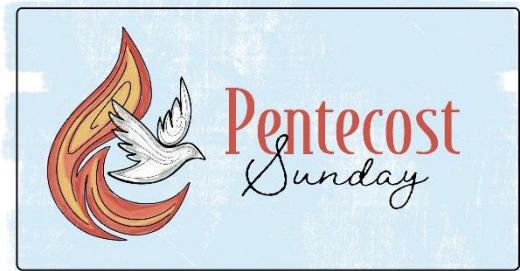

Celebrating the Holy Spirit, wear red and get fired up for worship!



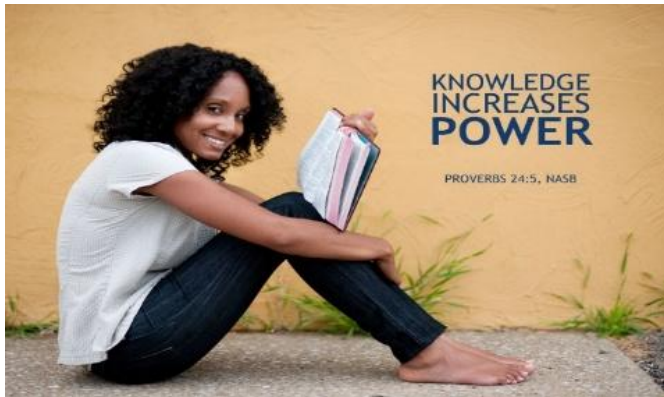
