Maundy Thursday Readers

Speakers in Fellowship Hall

Can you wire speakers?! We would like to use the wireless microphones in Fellowship Hall for Maundy Thursday but to do that we need to have speakers wired into the sanctuary sound system. Is this something you could do? We have speakers and will cover the cost of the wire and any other supplies needed. Ideally, this would be a permanent change with wires run through ceilings and walls but temporary wires run across the floor would work for this one event. Maundy Thursday Supper

We will gather in Fellowship Hall at 6 PM for a simply elegant soup and bread supper. We will celebrate Communion around the table as Jesus did with his disciples and then move into the service of Tenebrae. The sanctuary will be open for silent prayer from 6:00-9:00 PM.

Soup and Bread makers needed for Maundy Thursday. Our Maundy Thursday service will begin with a special meal of soup and bread. The worship team is looking for one or two bakers and one or two soup makers to volunteer to provide the food for the event.

Prudential Corner

Thank you for everyone's support as we put together the budget for 2023. The budget will be a living and breathing document over the course of the year. We will do our best to keep everyone informed as to the fluctuations on a month to month basis. The changes may come in the form of more income into the church (ie. higher and/or more pledges) or reductions in our expenses (including change from full-time to part-time ministry). Every little bit counts!!

At the Annual Meeting, the Congregation approved a budget that had a shortfall of \$97,225, which is the amount of money we will need to take out of our investments in order to pay the bills. Within this budget includes a full-time ministerial compensation package totaling \$112,810.

As of 3/20/2023, our investments at Vanguard (VPGDX - Vanguard Managed Allocation Fund) total \$321,291. Of that amount, \$44,800 is "Board Restricted" (Missions, Capital Improvement, Sabbatical) and \$42,000 "Donor is Restricted" (Youth Fellowship, Christian Education, Music Special, Memorial, Men's Fellowship, Community Garden). That leaves \$234,491 as unrestricted ("General Fund").

There has been some fluctuation since the Annual Meeting. As of 3/20/23, we are projecting that end of the year budget number to now be a shortfall of \$90,709 that would need to be taken out of our investments. This is mainly due to some more pledges that were received after the Annual Meeting and some other downward projections on the expenses side. We are hopeful to be able to make some more adjustments downward to our costs (is it too soon to consider that our snow removal totals Jan-Apr will be lower?) and look forward to any increases in the income side in the way of fundraising. Note that we have already withdrawn \$10,000 from investments in the month of January and another \$6,000 in March to cover expenses.

From Your Deacons

As we move through Lent, the Deacons are looking ahead to Holy Week services, which will include a Maundy Thursday soup supper and service, a daytime vigil on Good Friday, and sunrise and family services on Easter. All are welcome to attend one or multiple of these services.

We are also considering how services will be run after Rev. Geary's final service with us on April 23, on which date we will have a luncheon after worship in her honor. The Deacons are looking at a mixture of pulpit supply and lay person leadership until a settled pastor arrives. If you have ideas for worship or would like to help lead a service as a lay person (including reading scripture, leading prayer, or giving a brief message), please speak to one of the Deacons.

- \$10 each for Vacuum Cleaners/Roomba, Toaster Ovens, Ceiling Fans, Floor Lamps, Air Fryers, Electric Grills, Hot Plates, Small Radiators, Keyboard Pianos, Coffee Makers, Ice Makers, Small Household Appliances
- \$15 each for Flat Screen Computer Monitors, Small Microwaves
- \$20 each for CRT Computer Monitors, TVs up to 24," Dorm Sized Refrigerators, Dehumidifiers, Air Conditioners, Water Coolers, Large Printers/Copiers, Heat Lamps, Heaters, Propane Tanks (Empty), Range-Top/Large Microwaves
- \$25 each for TVs between 25" and 31,"
 Washing Machines, Stoves, Dishwashers,
 Large Appliances, Outdoor Grills,

Treadmills, Exercise Equipment, Snow Blowers, Lawn Mowers, Rototillers, Power Washers, Large Yard Equipment, Water Tanks

- \$30 each for TVs between 32" and 35," Large Refrigerators, Ride-On Lawn Mowers
- \$35 each for TVs over 36"
- \$40 each for Projection TVs
- NO CHARGE (Cash Donation Recommended): Cell Phones, Bicycles in any condition, Wires, Cables, Chargers, Car Batteries, Household Batteries Keyboards, Tablets.

Residents from all towns are welcome to recycle. Computer hard drives will be destroyed during the recycling process but can be removed on-site at the event for an additional charge. Cash payment is preferred, but checks will be an acceptable form of payments over \$30.
