Prudential Corner

Here is a summary of our finances over the first four months (1/1/23-4/30/23) of this year:

MANY thanks to everyone for keeping up with their pledges, which are close to being on budget. Our total Income also remains on budget, thanks in part to "Other Facility Rentals", which has been a good source of revenue. We see this as a continued area of opportunity, so spread the word!

Our expenses are close to being on budget and we look forward to the warmer months and a reduction in the expenses to keep the building warm. The transition from our Interim Pastor to a weekly coverage structure will also curb expenses in the coming months, though we look forward to the process of finding a permanent Pastor restarting again.

By the time this goes to print we will have withdrawn \$25,000 from our investment account to cover expenses. This will leave us with a balance of \$239,577.54 in the General Fund, \$50,840.81 in Board Restricted Funds, and \$42,106.05 in Donor Restricted Funds.

From Your Deacons

The Deacons are pleased to announce that Rev. Mary Perry will be providing pulpit supply for two Sundays each month. She will be with us on June 11 and 25, July 16 and 23, and August 13 and 27, with the potential to continue with us into the fall. The other two Sundays every month will be covered by the Deacons, so we ask you to continue thinking about any ideas you might have for worship. If you would like to help lead a service as a lay person (including reading scripture, leading prayer, or giving a brief message), please speak to one of the Deacons.

Instead of the first Sunday of the month, June 11 will be our Communion Sunday for the month of June. We are also looking for stories of fathers that you would be willing to share or have shared on your behalf during our Father's Day service on June 18, in a similar fashion to our Mother's Day service. If you have a story of a father or fatherly figure in your life to share, please contact one of the Deacons.

We plan on worshipping outside (weather permitting) throughout July and August, with the potential to worship outside on June 18 and 25 as well, which will be determined and announced as soon as possible. We will also be continuing our joint worship activities with the Federated Church of Norfolk this summer! Their congregation will be joining us on July 16 and 23, and we will worship in Norfolk on July 30 and August 6.

Would you like a nametag made for you for Church?

We offer nametags to all our members or friends that attend church with us for free. There's no requirement to wear them, it's just very helpful to newcomers, new friends and old friends who are terrible with faces and/or names. The name tags come in a plastic sleeve with a metal clip, but feel free to bring a lanyard instead! The basics of each name tag are:

- First Name (can be legal name, nickname, or both) & Last Name

- A Title, such as Member, Friend, or a position you hold in our church (such as Deacon, Welcoming Committee, Trustee, etc.)

- Your pronouns, such as He/Him, She/Her or They/Them

- If you belong to a marginalized group and would like to make that public by including the flag for that group

What's that flag/icon?

If you see a flag or icon on a nametag, that indicates that this person is a member of a marginalized group and has chosen to publicly display that to help reduce stigma of these groups and to make other people (who may also belong to marginalized groups) feel more welcome.
